



Installing and playing BirdGuides iDentify

This product contains files that you can copy onto your MP3 or MP4 player via your computer. Your player will need to be capable of handling full length song titles, and ideally be able to display album artwork.

† If you have an Apple iPod, iPod touch or iPhone, then you should follow the instructions to install via iTunes on the next page in B.

† If you have another type of player, then you should ideally follow the instructions for installing MP3 files that came with your particular player. If you don't have any specific instructions for your MP3 player, you could try the generic procedure A. below.

The European version of iDentify has no commentaries, only a spoken species name.

You can see the list of species for which tracks are provided on this product by opening the file **iDentify European Species List.pdf**.

A. Installing BirdGuides iDentify on MP3 player (generic)

1. Plug your MP3 player into your PC's USB port, wait until it mounts. Open My Computer and navigate to view the contents of your MP3 drive.
2. If you purchased this product on CD-ROM, insert the BirdGuides iDentify CD-ROM and double-click on the CD drive to view the contents of the CD in a second window. Open the **iDentify European** folder.

If you purchased this product as a download, double-click on **iDentify_Euro.zip**. It should open in a new window. Open the **iDentify European** folder.
3. Arrange your two windows so that you can see both your MP3 drive, and your **iDentify European** windows side by side.
4. Choose which language you wish to install by opening the appropriate folder in the **iDentify European** window.
5. From the **Edit** menu choose **Select All** to highlight all of the files inside the folder you just opened.
6. To ensure that the correct file order is maintained, left click and hold on the top file of the highlighted block and drag and drop the block onto your MP3 window.
7. Once all the files have finished copying, click on the **Safely Remove Hardware** icon in the bottom right of the Taskbar. Select **Safely Remove USB Mass Storage Device** with the appropriate allocated drive letter for your MP3 player, then disconnect your MP3 player.
8. You should now be able to use your MP3 player to browse and play the iDentify files that you have just installed.



B. Installing BirdGuides iDentify on iPod or iPhone via iTunes

This guide for installing BirdGuides iDentify products on Windows assumes that you have previously downloaded iTunes and installed your iPod or iPhone.

1. Do not connect your iPod to the computer at the beginning of this procedure.
2. **IMPORTANT:** First make sure that iTunes is configured to copy files to the iTunes Music folder. In iTunes, select **Edit** from the top menu bar, then **Preferences**. Select the **Advanced** tab. Make sure that **Copy files to iTunes Music Folder when adding to library** is checked and click **OK**.
3. In the **left-hand** bar of iTunes, select **Music** under **LIBRARY**.
4. If you purchased this product on CD-ROM, insert the BirdGuides iDentify CD-ROM.
If you purchased this product as a download, double-click on **iDentify_Euro.zip**. It should open in a new window. Open the **iDentify European** folder.
5. In iTunes, select **File** from the top menu bar, then **Add Folder to Library...** Navigate to the **iDentify European** folder on the CD-ROM or in the download folder and choose your preferred language folder.
6. Once you've selected the folder you want, click **OK**. This may take a few minutes - do not be alarmed if nothing appears to be happening initially. The iTunes information window at the top will show the files being copied over. Once this has finished you should see all the tracks in your iTunes music library.
7. When you have finished, you should **sync your iPod** to the computer. Plug in your iPod now. If your iTunes is set to Auto Sync, iTunes will now automatically update the iPod. This may take a few minutes; iTunes will tell you when it has finished in the top information window. You can now skip the manual update instructions below and continue with step 12.
8. If your iTunes is set to update your iPod manually, plug in your iPod to your PC, and wait for the iPod summary window to appear in iTunes. The **Manually manage music and videos** checkbox should be ticked.
9. In iTunes **LIBRARY | Music**, click on the heading of the **Artist** column – you should be able to scroll to the **BirdGuides – iDentify** tracks.
10. Click on the first of these **BirdGuides – iDentify** tracks to highlight it, then scroll down to the last of the **BirdGuides – iDentify** tracks and, whilst holding down the **shift** key, click on the last of the tracks; the whole block will be highlighted.
11. Drag the highlighted files and drop them on your iPod icon in the left-hand bar under **DEVICES**. This may take a few minutes; iTunes will show you the progress in its top information window.
12. Right-click on your iPod in the **DEVICES** list, and choose **Eject** from the menu.
13. It is now safe to disconnect your iPod from the computer. To play the tracks on your iPod, scroll to **Music | Albums** – scroll to the required **family name (Album)** – then to the required track, and play.
